 'Covid-19 Catch Up Premium' statement 2020-21



The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds. Rosslyn Park Primary and Nursery School will use this funding for specific activities to support our pupils to 'catch up' for any lost learning and opportunities to retrieve their previous knowledge over the months of school closure.

Strategy Statement

To ensure maximum impact, 'Covid-19 catch up Premium' will sit at the heart of a whole school effort, with all staff understanding the strategy and their role within it. At Rosslyn Park we have implemented a tiered approach to help focus on a small number of strategies that are likely to make the biggest difference:

- Targeted Academic Support
- Wider Strategies

Teaching	£34,780	Two additional teachers to support Quality First Teaching. They will provide in class support and small group tuition for pupils across the school.	
Targeted academic support	£13,360	Two additional teaching assistants to support with targeted small groups and 1:1 interventions and in class 1:1 support.	
Wider strategies	£500	To provide additional wellbeing provision to support most vulnerable pupils with ready to learn behaviour.
